ESSENTIALS OF FIREFIGHTING

Training Objectives: To present systems for improving fire ground safety; to show safe procedures for riding fire apparatus; to demonstrate how to safely shut off utilities at an emergency scene; and to show safety policies for responding to electrical emergencies.

Training Objectives: To present the functions of each component of the SCBA system; to identify the safety features associated with various types of SCBA; to describe potential SCBA limitations as they relate to the wearer, equipment and the air supply; and to identify many of the hazardous environments that will require use of protective breathing apparatus.

VOL. 5 - SCBA 2: USE & MAINTENANCE

Training Objectives: To demonstrate donning and doffing techniques for SCBA while wearing protective clothing; to describe inspection and care procedures for protective breathing apparatus; to demonstrate how to change cylinders at an emergency scene; and to present safety precautions and rules for SCBA use during an emergency situation.

VOL. 6 - PERSONAL PROTECTIVE CLOTHING

Training Objectives: To demonstrate the components of full protective clothing used and the limitations of each; to show proper protective clothing to be worn as a station or work uniform; and to present procedures for care and maintenance of personal protective clothing.

VOL. 7 - PORTABLE EXTINGUISHERS

Training Objectives: To present the classification and rating system used; to show the general operating instructions; to describe different types of hand-held fire extinguishers and demonstrate how to use each type; to show a firefighter's responsibilities when inspecting portable fire extinguishers.

Training Objectives: To present various types and uses for fire service rope; to show how to inspect, maintain, and store rope; to demonstrate how to tie six knots required by NFPA 1001; and to present how to use rope to hoist equipment.

Training Objectives: To demonstrate basic techniques and safety considerations for suppressing structural fires; to present three methods of water application; and to demonstrate basic fire suppression tactics for controlling other types of fires.

Training Objectives: To define the parts of a ladder using fire service terms; to describe various types of ladders; to discuss ladder construction and ladder maintenance procedures; and to demonstrate proper ladder handling methods.

Training Objectives: To describe correct ladder placement techniques; to demonstrate procedures for raising and positioning ladders; and to show the correct method for climbing ladders and placing a roof ladder.

Training Objectives: To identify the principles and advantages of proper ventilation in structural fire fighting; to show the causes and signs of a potential backdraft explosion; to describe various types of horizontal ventilation; and to present basic procedures for forced ventilation.

Training Objectives: To present various types of common roof construction; to describe various types of vertical ventilation; to demonstrate ventilation procedures for flat and pitched roofs using both hand and power tools; and to present how to determine the integrity of a roof system.

VOL. 14 - FIRE HOSE BASICS

Training Objectives: To present basic information about fire hose; to identify common hose couplings; to show common hose appliances and tools; and to demonstrate three hose roll methods.

Training Objectives: To show several types of hose loads and finishes; to present three basic hose lays; and to demonstrate methods of coupling and uncoupling hose.

Training Objectives: To define a fire stream and the basic sizes and types of fire streams; to present three methods of water application; to describe different types of fire hose nozzles; and to define water hammer and show how to prevent it.

Training Objectives: To present the types of tools used in forcible entry; to present procedures for through-the-lock entry on doors; and to demonstrate forced entry through three different types of doors and windows.

Training Objectives: To present several methods of receiving alarms from the public; to show the operation of several types of alarm-initiating devices, including smoke detectors; to identify methods of alerting fire department personnel of an emergency; and to demonstrate how to use communications equipment at the station and on the fireground.

IDENTIFYING THE UN/DOT HAZARD CLASSES: LABELS & PLACARDS

Designed to be used as part of a training program in hazardous materials awareness and identification for emergency response personnel who must be able to identify the DOT hazard classes and recognize U.S. and Canadian placards and labels for hazardous materials, as required by NFPA 472. The program is also intended for workers in business, industry, government, health care, and transportation who use, handle, store and/or transport hazardous materials and who must be trained in emergency response to hazardous substance releases according to OSHA regulations as documented in 29 CFR, Part 1910.120.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS - AWARENESS: PROGRAM I

Designed for training to detect, identify, pre-plan and size-up hazardous materials in emergency situations. Helps first responders understand the potential risks of hazardous materials, and stresses safety and awareness, especially in incidents involving unreported hazardous materials. The program teaches the first responder five First Responder Guidelines to observe when evidence of hazardous materials is detected at an emergency scene.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS - IDENTIFICATION: PROGRAM II

Designed for training first responders to detect, identify, pre-plan and size-up hazardous materials in emergency situations. This program describes five common identification resources that first responders can use to perform the first essential step in any hazardous materials operation – positive identification of the substance.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS - PRE-INCIDENT RISK ANALYSIS: PROGRAM III

Designed to train first responders to detect and identify hazardous materials, and pre-plan and size-up hazardous materials emergency situations. This program presents an overview of preparing for and conducting a hazardous materials pre-incident risk analysis. The program includes how to locate hazard sites, how to conduct a site survey, and what to look for when reading Material Safety Data Sheets.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS - PRE-INCIDENT ACTION PLANS: PROGRAM IV

This fourth program in the series is for training first responders to detect and identify hazardous materials and pre-plan and size-up hazardous materials emergency situations. The program includes how to review existing plans, how to prepare or study special hazardous materials incident response plans, and how to test and practice plans through inter-agency training exercise.

ARSON DETECTION FOR THE FIRST RESPONDER

This 2-day course is designed specifically to provide a clear definition of the role of initial responder organizations, and to provide essential knowledge to enable them to recognize the potential of an intentionally set fire, preserve evidence, and properly report the information to appropriate officials. EMERGENCY RESPONSE TO TERRORISM: BASIC CONCEPTS

This 2-day course is designed for the senior-level officer(s) who may be responsible for command of incidents involving terrorism. It is intended to build upon existing skills as an Incident Commander and knowledge of terrorism from professional experience or from the Emergency Response to Terrorism: Basic Concepts (ERT:BC) or the Emergency Response to Terrorism: Self-Study (ERT:SS) course. The class will assist the command officer in preparing an effective response to the consequences of terrorism. For the response to be effective, plans must be in place to guide responders in managing the incident. Incident Commanders must be prepared to operate as part of a multi-agency, multidiscipline, and multi-jurisdictional response. To address the command and control challenges that likely will confront the Incident Commander, the class consists of lecture supported by case studies and practice scenarios. This will enable the students to apply their knowledge of pre-incident planning, managing emergency incidents, and operating as part of a Unified Command structure. **Kit contents:** 2 Instructor guides; 2 CD's; VHS tape "Out of Chaos";

ID NO. 369

FIRE CAUSE DETERMINATION FOR COMPANY OFFICERS

This course is designed to provide basic training in the principal aspects of fire origin and cause determination. It is a basic course that will permit the company officer to understand the key role the company members play in helping to determine fire origin and cause and in preserving important evidence for any subsequent investigation. This course is not for investigators and should not be used as training for new arson investigators.
